

Structure Markings

In the left hand margin of each score you will notice some letters, these are abbreviations for the song section you are in. The list below explains what each abbreviation is:

in. - intro

v.- verse

p.v. - pre verse

br. - bridge

g.s. - guitar solo

out. - outro

sax. - saxophone solo

d.s. - drum solo

p.s. - piano solo

m.8 – middle 8

ch. - chorus

p.c. - pre chorus

ref. - refrain

inst. - instrumental

t.s. - trumpet solo

o.s. - organ solo

b.s. - bass solo

When a number appears after the abbreviation, this can refer to one of two things. Firstly when there are two or more different sections both having the name applied to them. For example **in.1** and **in.2** or **br.1** and **br.2**, this implies that whilst both sections are intro's or bridges, they are both built from different musical concepts.

Secondly, it can refer to similar parts being repeated. For example **v.1** and **v.2**. This implies that both sections have some similar musical repetition, it could be a vocal part

or a guitar part or a drum part.
